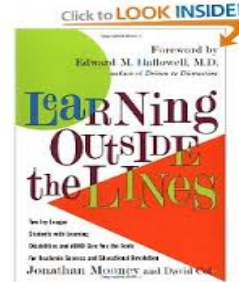

Jonathan Mooney was one of “those kids”. One of those kids who couldn't sit still and spent elementary school hiding in the bathroom to escape reading out loud with tears streaming down his face. Jonathan beat the odds, graduating from Brown University with an honors degree in English literature. How did he do it? That question is the heart of Jonathan's personal, humorous, and research based talk: **Learning Outside the Lines**. In his keynote presentation, Jonathan will explore three ideas that changed his life and that all counselors and educators can adopt to support vulnerable and at risk learners.
